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Inn of the Five Graces, Santa Fe, New Mexico

This high-end bed-and-breakfast—from the hotel group behind New York State's Lake Placid Lodge and The Point—has 22 suites replete with patios and fireplaces. The eclectic Asian aesthetic includes Afghan rugs, carved Tibetan columns, East Indian silks, and Native American pottery. Fridges are stocked with complimentary beverages, biscuits, Camembert, foie gras, and gourmet chocolates; also gratis are breakfasts of fresh-baked breads, muffins, fruits, and quiche, as well as afternoon tea and wine. Turndown amenities—a Native American dream catcher and homemade cookies—are yet another well-thought-out treat, as are the daily memos about what's doing in town. While the Five Graces doesn't have a proper restaurant, Santa Fe is a foodie town and the inn, located in one of the city's oldest neighborhoods, is within walking distance of the center. When to go: High season (May-Oct.) or in winter, to take advantage of the romantic fireplaces. Which room to book: An upper-level suite with a refurbished bathroom (505-992-0957; www.fivegraces.com; doubles, \$295-\$445; **(E)**). **(9)**
